Richland County: Small Business has a Big Impact

November is quickly becoming our "Small Business Month" here at the Richland Area Chamber. On the 18th we will host our Small Business of the Year luncheon where we will honor six of the best local small businesses and ultimately crown two of them as the winners for 2016. Then just a week later is the

7th annual "Small Business Saturday", one day after Black Friday. For an organization that has a charge to improve the business climate, I can't think of a more appropriate focus than small businesses.

According to the Small Business Administration (SBA), small businesses have a big impact. Consider these national stats:

- The 28 million small businesses in America account for 54% of all U.S. sales.
- Small businesses provide 55% of all jobs and 66% of all net new jobs since the 1970s.
- The 600,000 plus franchised small businesses in the U.S. account for 40% of all retail sales and provide jobs for some 8 million people.
- The small business sector in America occupies 30-50% of all commercial space, an estimated 20-34 billion square feet.

In Ohio, there are nearly 928,000 small businesses, representing about 98% of all business, and they employ 2.1 million Ohioans. If those same ratios hold true in Richland County, that would mean of 2,613 employers in the County over 2,500 of those would be classified as small business. To be sure, for a healthy economy we need successful businesses of all sizes, but small businesses can be especially important.

I grew up in a family of small business owners. My parents owned several businesses (food service, construction and retail), my grandfather was a developer and my uncles also ran several businesses. I saw first-hand what it takes to be successful. There can be sleepless nights where you wonder how you will make payroll, shortened time with your family as you try to make sure everything is covered, becoming a jack of all trades as you tackle a myriad of issues not to mention how much you often have to financially risk to make it all come together.

Perhaps it is because of that experience, but I love working with and supporting small businesses. This year we had over 60 nominees for the Small Business of the Year awards, 24 actually applied for the award and we will soon be announcing our 6 finalists. We revamped the whole process last year to make it align with the national award given out by the US Chamber of Commerce. We were thrilled when MHS Industrial Supply (our 2015 winner in the 15 employees & under category) went on to become a Blue Ribbon winner, showing they were one of the top 100 in the country. This year promises to be no less exciting, we have some stellar nominees!

This year will also mark the 2nd year since several local business organizations have joined together to promote a countywide effort for "Small Business Saturday". I hope that you will consider earmarking at least a portion of your holiday spending for our local small businesses. Last year, we had 65 local businesses participate and we expect that number to grow this year.

Sometimes I hear, "But I can't find what I need at a small business." My response is, "Are you really looking?" I say that because I can think of a whole ton of items that you can buy from small businesses: books, women's & men's apparel, boots, home décor, antiques, food & kitchen items, make-up, lotions, jewelry & other accessories, tools, power equipment, vehicles, handmade items, fresh flowers, shoes, toys and so much more.

If you agree that small businesses make a big impact on our local economy, please join us in the #ShopSmall movement this holiday season. Participate in Small Business Saturday, visit some new stores, and help us reinvigorate our local economy. Our future is up to us, so let's get to work!

Bill Sharp bids fond farewell to Richland County

Retires from Chamber Foundation after 16 years Brittany Schock, Staff Reporter, Richland Source

MANSFIELD – To everything there is a season. Bill Sharp will end his time as the director of the Mansfield-Richland Area Education Foundation during his favorite season.

"I love fall," Sharp said on a particularly brisk October morning. "I have family that loves hot and humid weather, but I just don't like it. I like the seasons and the rolling hills in Richland County."

That love of Richland County led to a 16-year career as director of the Chamber Foundation. It makes it that much more difficult to imagine leaving this place as Sharp prepares to retire on Oct. 21.

"I've never done this before so I don't know how to be retired," he said with a laugh. "I'll find out I guess."

A native of Richland County, Sharp graduated from Malabar High School in 1966 and earned his undergraduate degree from Ashland University. From there, he attended graduate school in Denver, Colorado and also lived for three years in Florida during the 1970s before moving back to his hometown.

After working in the aircraft business and the media for most of his career, Sharp took over as director of the Chamber Foundation in 2000.

"I remembered my experience with Leadership Unlimited (in 1988), and although that was only one component of the foundation it had a real impact on my life, and I thought I'd really enjoy it," Sharp said. "So I applied, and fortunately was hired."

Since then, Sharp has overseen a number of successful programs through the Foundation, including Leadership Unlimited, Young Leaders Institute, Economic Club and Inside Richland County. In 2015, Sharp launched the Young Entrepreneurs Academy (YEA! Richland), an innovative program which teaches students how to launch and run their own businesses.

"Honestly, I was thinking about retiring last year, but when YEA! came about I said I can't leave now, this is too much fun, and it was," Sharp said. "We just finished recruiting for this year's class, we have a larger class from last year and some new schools participating. Most of the volunteers, from speakers to investors to field trip hosts, they've all come back."

Sharp's favorite part about the various programs he oversees is easily the people – emerging leaders who are excited to learn more about Richland County. He's quick to credit the success of the programs not to himself, but to the participants.

"Leadership Unlimited, for example, is not a life-changing experience for everybody, but it has been for a few," Sharp said. "To watch those few suddenly say 'wow, I had no idea this was going on in Richland County and I have to be involved,' that's been very rewarding. I expect them to discover new things in the county and meet a lot of people, but a life-changing experience is a nice side effect."

Sharp has said repeatedly that he's got "the best job in Richland County," so the decision to retire did not come easily. Mostly, Sharp attributes his retirement to age, a function of not just years.

"A few years ago I was watching a speaker and I look over, and a young lady is looking down at her phone, and I could feel myself getting mad," he said. "When the speaker stopped, the young lady made a very cogent point about the speaker's subject.

"It just occurred to me this year that she might have been taking notes. And I thought, it's time for someone that's a little more savvy and closer to the age of the young professionals I'm working with, I think it would be more helpful to them."

When it comes to his replacement, Sharp hopes the next director of the Chamber Foundation brings a touch of youth to the position, as well as an open mind.

"I grew up in Richland County, and I learned so much about things going on in Richland County that I was not aware of, and met people from areas I was not familiar with," he said. "I learn every year so many new things, it's really fun and it's surprising to me how diverse and exciting things are in Richland County."

After a career dedicated to immersing himself in Richland County, Sharp and his wife Lucia are moving away from the county for his retirement. The couple purchased a home on Lake Erie in Port Clinton, and shortly after Sharp's retirement will be moving there full-time.

It's a bittersweet feeling for Sharp, not being fully involved in the county for the first time in over a decade. But in a way, his job will continue – learning all about his new community, and enjoying himself along the way.

"It's going to be odd I think, but new experience is what it's all about it, so let's go and find out and have fun," Sharp said. "It's been a great ride."


