The Earth Stewardship Celebration is an opportunity for residents, churches, non-profit organizations, businesses, schools, and government agencies, and other groups to renew their commitment to our community by scheduling and conducting a litter clean up, beautification project, tree planting, and /or recycling project which will help to move us toward a sustainable community and environment of which we can be proud.

The projects can take place anytime during April & May and I encourage to take the step of formally registering your project. They can give you bags and gloves to help assist you with the clean-up process. If you are thinking about cleaning up a public area, it's great to let them know that you will be helping out. There is so much area to cover that undoubtedly there is a great place for you to help out.

We need YOUR help in cleaning up our community. I hear so much talk of eliminating blight. This is a great way to help in that fight. Cleaning up sends the message that we care about our community...and we do! So grab some co-workers, choose a location, register your project and have fun. You'll be amazed at the difference you can make in just 60 minutes!
