Calling all Young Entrepreneurs!

Visit the Mansfield Memorial Museum and you will see plenty of evidence of our entrepreneurial past. In fact, some of our finest institutions exist in large part due to the generosity of these early entrepreneurial pioneers. But entrepreneurship is not just a thing of the past here in Richland County. Still today, plenty of people are risking it all to start up their dream business. In fact, you could argue that there has never been a better time to start a business here locally. There are a wide array of organizations that exist to help support and nurture local entrepreneurs.



The Chamber and the Mansfield-Richland Area Education Foundation are excited to be partnering to bring a unique entrepreneurship program to our area for the first time. The Young Entrepreneurs Academy (YEA!) is a seven-month program for high school and middle school aged students who want to learn how to start their own business.

Some of you might be scoffing right now, thinking to yourself, "What can a teenager possibly accomplish?" A quick search on Google for "teenage entrepreneurs" turned up a list longer than I can recount. The Subway restaurant chain was founded by Fred DeLuca at age 17. Of course, we've all heard of Mark Zuckerberg, who founded Facebook while in college, and has made more money than he can possibly spend in just eleven short years.

YEA! is a unique program because the students do not just learn about entrepreneurship, they actually found their own business. They will create an idea, write a business plan, pitch it to local investors and launch it all in the course of about seven months. This fantastic program was founded at the University of Rochester back in 2004 and is now at over 100 sites across the country.

As you may know, I formerly led a Chamber in suburban Rochester where I first came into contact with the program. People were raving about it but I was skeptical. Finally, I was invited to the "Trade Show" where the students have a chance to sell their products and services. Seeing is believing and I was a believer from that point forward. I saw students with real products, professional marketing brochures and who could work the room better than many of the adults I knew. YEA! really works.

Our Chamber went on to run a branch of the program for four years and I had a great time working with the students each year. It was amazing to see the change that happened from beginning to end. They walked in slightly unsure of themselves and their products, and graduated as teenage CEO's who were ready to take on the world. I had products as wide-ranging as websites, duck calls, long boards, t-shirts, dance costumes, handbags, greeting cards, tissue box covers and more created over the course of four years.

Will all of those students retire someday still owning those businesses? Of course not, but they left the program knowing what it took to run their own business. The statistics are impressive from the YEA! corporate headquarters – 100% of YEA! Graduates finish high school on time, 99% go on to college, 50% will operate their business for one year or more and 19% will go on to start a second business.
