

INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION HEARINGS: NAVIGATING CONTINUANCE REQUESTS

If you're an employer dealing with a workers' compensatior claim, you may face an Industrial Commission (IC) hearing. These hearings, addressing contested matters, occur at one of the 12 IC offices statewide, often near the injured worker's residence. Sometimes, circumstances require a hearing postponement.

Understanding Continuance Requests:

- Good Cause Requests:

 These must be submitted at least five calendar days before the hearing date.
 - They usually stem from unavoidable scheduling conflicts that cannot be adjusted.
 - Supporting evidence, such as company statements or travel documents, can bolster the request's validity.

- Extraordinary Circumstances:
 These involve unexpected events like sudden illness, hospitalization, or family emergencies.
 - Requests based on such circumstances can be made up to the day of the hearing.

Request Process:

- To initiate a continuance request, employers can either complete a form on the Industrial Commission's website or fax it directly to the relevant IC office.
- Local Hearing Administrators evaluate requests based on predefined standards of "good cause" or "extraordinary circumstance.

Assistance Available:

Sedgwick's claims team is ready to assist employers in filing continuance requests and ensuring adherence to IC protocols.

The Richland County Foundation talked with students about aspects of the community they would like to see in 2030 and beyond.
















Richland Newhope and its partner agencies serve individuals with disabilities every day in extradinary ways.




