




Digital Skilling: Opportunities for Mid Ohio

I furiously used the up arrow to catch the mole running across the screen. Then the down arrow; and a quick right arrow. A middle school student coded a whack-a-



The Chamber's Microsoft TechSpark grant funded the Code a Carnival Camp along with several other opportunities. Microsoft is investing in local communities across the U.S. and Mexico with the goals of fostering digital skilling and employability, broadband expansion, and helping organizations thrive. The Chamber is fortunate to represent Ohio in this fellowship. With the \$100,000 investment over two years, our focus is computer science education, digital skilling, and career pipelines for local organizations.

During the 2023-2024 school year, we launched several K-12 initiatives including:

- •Girls Who Code community partnership that allows schools and organizations to access curriculum and resources for 3rd-12th grade coding clubs. Sign up is free at girlswhocode.com/apply. So far, we have 37 students enrolled across three clubs in Richland County.
- Career Pathways in Technology workshop between ES Consulting and Ontario High School that can be replicated for other districts.
- •179th Cyberspace Wing Electronics for Beginners Camp for 13 high school students. Students learned Arduino programming and used a kit to program fans, security systems, and light switches, for example.
- Shawshank Showdown presenting sponsorship which introduced FIRST Robotics to Richland County through a high school competition with 19 teams from Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Michigan with 5 to 15 students each. Elementary and middle school programs were included as well.
- •Support of Richland County's Teacher Technology Bootcamp in partnership with Mid-Ohio ESC and Ashland University. 10 teachers visited six technology-oriented businesses and made presentations about how they will incorporate technology into their curriculum.

A cybersecurity speaker series and certificate are in development with the Ohio State University at Mansfield to help community members understand the citizenship and economic impacts of cybersecurity on Richland County.

We're seeing businesses become engaged with our initiatives and students become more aware of the many technology pathways available to them. We are interested in working with additional partners for the 2024-2025 school year. Let's work together to invest in computer science education and digital skilling to develop pipelines of talent and a thriving local economy.

13th Annual Earth Stewardship Take Pride Contest

The Earth Stewardship Celebration, now in its 28th year, invites local groups, businesses, government agencies, neighborhoods, churches, non-profits and residents the opportunity to be a part of Planting Pride in all of Richland County by conducting a project from April 1st – August 1st.

What is the Take Pride! Earth Stewardship Contest?

- Earth Stewardship participants take before and after photos of their project and submit the photos by August 4th.
- Projects are "judged" by a panel of judges who include leaders in our community, businesses, and residents.
- Awards are given to the top 3 places in each category. (Categories include: Businesses, Government, Neighborhood, School, Church/Non-profit organizations).
- Plus voters get to choose the **People's Choice Award** by casting their "vote" via our Facebook page. Scan this code to visit our page and see some of our previous years projects.

Presenting the Star Award

In an effort to recognize each village/city within Richland County for their projects, our judges will also choose the "Star Award," for each community.

How does this work? Here's an example:

The City of Ontario has 4 schools, 2 civic groups, and 6 businesses who register and complete a project throughout the months of April and July. One of those projects will win the Star Award.

And yes – a Star Award will be presented for each village and city in Richland County that registers a project.

> Does your business, church, organization have more than 1 location in Richland County?

<u>Each location</u> may register a project for the Earth Stewardship Celebration. (You can start a "friendly competition" amongst your locations and city/village).

What is a project? A project may include but is not limited to: Litter clean up, tree plantings, beautification projects, butterfly gardens, rain gardens, energy efficiency project, recycling project, native plant/pollinator gardens, removal of graffiti, paintings, park projects and more. (Think curb appeal and the environment). Visit the Earth Stewardship Celebration Facebook page to see some past projects and participants.

OHIO WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND EXPERIENCE MODIFICATION RATE (EMR)

An employer's experience modification rate (EMR), determined by the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC), significantly impacts the workers' compensation premiums an employer pays. A safer workplace with minimal workers' compensation claims results in a better-than-average EMR, whereas a workplace with numerous costly claims results in a worse-than-average EMR. Typically, a lower EMR translates to lower premiums paid to the BWC.

Determining EMR

The BWC calculates your EMR using historical payroll data, industry type, and claim costs. A company with typical claim costs for its size and industry will have an EMR of 1.0. Companies with lower claim costs will have an EMR below 1.0, while those with higher claim costs will have an EMR above 1.0. A lower EMR results in lower premiums compared to similar businesses, whereas a higher EMR results in higher premiums.

Benefits of a Lower EMR

A lower EMR increases the likelihood of qualifying for substantial discounts through group rating programs and group retrospective rating programs. These programs enable employers to collaborate for additional discounts or rebates on their premiums, with potential savings exceeding 50%.

Reducing EMR

An employer's EMR is based on past claims and historical payroll categorized by industry type. To lower your EMR, you must reduce claims and claim costs. The best way to improve your EMR is through a robust workplace safety program that prevents claims from occurring.

Strategies for Claims

If a claim does occur, several strategies can help reduce overall claim costs. Ensuring injured workers recover and return to work safely and quickly is crucial. Partnering with Sedgwick can help implement effective strategies to manage specific claims and keep costs down.


















FORKLIFT SAFETY IN THE WORKPLACE



Forklifts, also known as powered industrial trucks, are vital in various industries, from manufacturing and construction to warehousing and logistics. However, their operation poses significant risks if not managed properly. This guide outlines key safety measures to mitigate risks associated with forklift operations.

Pre-Shift Inspections:

- Conduct daily pre-shift examinations of forklifts.
