

Celebrating a Year of Leadership & Growth

As we close out the 2024–2025 programming year, I'm proud to reflect on the incredible momentum built across our leadership and community initiatives. From high school students to seasoned professionals, our programs continue to shape the future of Richland County.

Leadership Unlimited wrapped up its 41st year with a memorable alumni dinner and commencement, celebrating the Class of 2025 and their capstone project with National Alliance on Mental Illness - NAMI Richland County. We welcomed the Class of 2026 and honored Fred Boll as Outstanding Alumnus. Throughout the year, LU alumni stayed engaged by hosting socials, volunteering at the Ohio Bird Sanctuary and Domestic Violence Shelter, and leading events like the Mayoral Vision Panel and our first Nonprofit Fair.

Engage Richland had a strong first year by giving young professionals hands-on leadership experience through workshops, tours, and mentoring. Their capstone project supported Rubies Women's Group with \$1,400 raised and hands-on renovations to a home for women and children.


The Young Leaders Institute concluded its second year with 39 high school sophomores from seven districts exploring local government, healthcare, and business. Their capstone raised over \$2,100 for The New Store, showing that leadership starts early and makes a real impact.

Our Discover Richland Tours offered deeper insight into local development. The fall Economic Development Tour brought 30 business leaders to 10 sites, including the Westinghouse site, Innovision Automation, and The Ontario Center. In the spring, participants toured seven healthcare facilities to explore how health systems shape quality of life and economic growth, thanks to Richland Public Health and our healthcare partners.

We also advanced innovation and workforce development through the Microsoft TechSpark Grant, supporting programs like Gener8tor for Manufacturers, cybersecurity events in partnership with OSU-Mansfield, middle school coding events with North Central State College, and high school electronics camps with the 179th Cyberspace Wing and OSU-Mansfield.

Thank you to our sponsors, mentors, alumni, and community partners. Your support fuels leadership, connection, and progress in Richland County. We look forward to another impactful year in 2025–2026!

State Seeks Ohio Employer Feedback with In-Demand Jobs Survey

COLUMBUS, OHIO – Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) Director Matt Damschroder today announced the opening of the latest In-Demand Jobs Survey for Ohio businesses to provide feedback on the state's In-Demand Jobs List.

"Tracking Ohio's top jobs helps paint the picture of Ohio's workforce needs," said Damschroder. "Understanding the future labor market helps us plan programming and ultimately helps inform students and job-seekers looking at potential careers."

ODJFS manages the survey in partnership with the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation and the InnovateOhio Platform. It allows businesses to offer input on Ohio's current and future in-demand jobs in just minutes.

Ohio is required to maintain an up-to-date In-Demand Jobs List that directs the spending of 85% of federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act training funds. Although not required, Ohio surveys employers to ensure that state programs meet business needs. The DeWine administration launched an updated and streamlined survey in 2019 to gather feedback on how the state could help job seekers connect to job opportunities. Information on top jobs can be found at topiobs.ohio.gov.

The <u>current survey</u> is open to all businesses registered in Ohio, giving small and large businesses alike the opportunity to shape how Ohio prepares people for the workforce.

COMPLACENCY IN THE WORKPLACE: A HIDDEN RISK



In any workplace, routine can create comfort, but also risk. Complacency happens when an employee has done a task for so long without incident that they assume nothing will go wrong. This mindset can lead to skipped safety steps, overlooked hazards, and serious injuries.

Example:

An employee conducts daily safety inspections without issue for months. One day, they skip it and nothing happens. Eventually, inspections are dropped entirely. That is when accidents strike. Complacency lulls even experienced workers into letting their guard down.

Signs of Complacency:

- Skipping steps or safety procedures
- Rise in near-misses or minor incidents
- Declining motivation or attitude
- Poor communication
- · Tardiness or disengagement

What Employees Can Do:

- Stay focused and recognize distractions
- Look for small process improvements
- Understand how their work supports the bigger picture
- Stay connected with coworkers

Complacency can affect anyone, but by working together and staying engaged, your team can reduce risks, improve morale, and create a safer workplace.



Get Involved

TIME TO COMPLETE YOUR BWC TRUE-UP

At the end of each policy year, the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) requires employers to report actual payroll and reconcile premium estimates. This is known as the true-up process. If your actual payroll was higher than estimated, you pay the difference. If it was lower, you may receive a refund.

Missed the deadline? You risk:

- · Losing eligibility for rebates and incentive programs
- Being removed from current BWC programs
- Becoming ineligible for future programs until all past true-ups are completed

How to File:

The fastest way is online through your BWC e-account at bwc.ohio.gov. You will need your policy number or Federal Tax ID. Phone reporting is available at (800) OHIO-BWC, but wait times may be long.

Deadline:

Private employers must complete true-up and payment by August 31, 2025.

There is no grace period—everything must be posted by the deadline.
