

# Driving Workforce Access Forward

Richland County has been nationally recognized for its leadership in tackling one of the region's most persistent workforce challenges: transportation. Richland County Transit (RCT), in partnership with the North End Community Improvement Collaborative (NECIC), was selected as one of only four grantees in the United States to receive a federal Mobility, Access, and Transportation Insecurity (MATI) Phase 2 grant.

This award, administered through the Center for Transportation Studies at the University of Minnesota and funded by the Federal Transit Administration, supports innovative pilot projects that improve mobility and access to jobs. The recognition highlights Richland County's strong local collaboration and its commitment to creating practical solutions that connect residents with employment opportunities.

With this funding, RCT and NECIC will launch a one-year workforce transportation pilot program designed to expand service hours for individuals working second, third, and early first shifts. The pilot will add early morning routes from 4:00 – 7:30 a.m. and late evening routes from 7:00 p.m. – midnight, Monday through Friday. These expanded hours will directly address gaps identified by workers, employers, and community stakeholders through extensive local surveys and focus groups.

The program was developed using feedback from more than 700 community members, many of whom reported that limited transit hours were a barrier to getting or keeping jobs. Reliable transportation plays a critical role in workforce stability, particularly for employees in manufacturing, healthcare, and service industries who work nontraditional hours.

In addition to helping residents reach job hubs such as the Airport Industrial Park, this initiative will also benefit local businesses that have faced ongoing challenges recruiting and retaining staff. By improving access to consistent, affordable transportation, the pilot program aims to reduce absenteeism, improve reliability, and support overall economic growth across Richland County.

The project also reflects a strong spirit of local collaboration among RCT, NECIC, employers, workforce organizations, and community partners. Together, these groups are working to design and test solutions that can be scaled or adapted in the future. The lessons learned from this pilot could serve as a model for other mid-sized communities across Ohio and beyond.

Employers and community members are encouraged to stay involved as the pilot progresses. Those interested in providing input, reviewing data, or sharing workforce insights are invited to join the stakeholder team.

# State's Child Care Program Aims to Improve Access and Affordability

The State of Ohio has launched a new pilot program designed to make quality child care more affordable and accessible for working families.

Under the Child Care Cred Program, the cost of monthly child care is shared among employees, their employers, and the Ohio Department of Children and Youth. Employees pay 40 percent, employers contribute another 40 percent, and the department covers the remaining 20 percent, as funding allows through June 30, 2026.

The initiative is part of the state's broader effort to strengthen Ohio's workforce by helping parents remain employed while ensuring their children receive reliable, high-quality care. The program also offers an opportunity for employers to support their staff and improve employee retention through shared investment.



### WORKPLACE STRESS: WHAT IT IS AND HOW TO MANAGE IT



Workplace stress is becoming a growing concern across many industries because it affects employee well-being. safety, and productivity. Stress can influence mental and physical health, reduce focus, and make it harder for employees to stay aware of their surroundings. Whether it comes from personal challenges or work demands, understanding what causes stress and finding ways to manage it are essential to maintaining a healthy and productive environment.

Common causes of workplace stress include heavy workloads, tight deadlines, poor communication, unclear job expectations, job insecurity, and lack of support from management. Other factors such as organizational changes, inadequate training, and long hours can also contribute to burnout. Recognizing these sources is the first step toward reducing their impact.

Employees can manage stress by communicating openly with their manager or Human Resources department. maintaining a healthy work-life balance, and developing coping skills such as deep breathing, meditation, or exercise. Eating well and participating in company wellness programs can also improve both mental and physical health. If stress becomes overwhelming, seeking professional help from a doctor or therapist can be an important step toward recovery. Employers also play an important role in minimizing stress in the workplace. Encouraging open communication, offering flexible scheduling options, setting realistic workloads, and clearly defining job roles can make a significant difference. Promoting regular breaks and providing access to resources such as employee assistance programs or mental health workshops can help staff feel supported and valued.

### **How to Participate**

- Slap Wristbands and Window Cling with Working Thermometer: These easy to use low tech tools remind you (and those around you) to double check your car's backseat for kids and pets! Contact or visit Richland Public Health to receive yours and start using them today!
- Bluetooth Car Seat Sensor: The Doona SensAlert detects the presence of a child on board and warns the caregiver (or emergency contacts) with three incremental levels of alert if the child is left unattended in the car. It uses an intelligent cloud-based system to send messages and calls, so it does not depend on the phone's signal or status. To install a Doona SensAlert in your vehicle, you must set up an appointment with an RPH Car Seat Technician. \*Proof of Richland County residency is required. Limit 1 Doona SensAlert per child.
